of Captain Geo W Patrick company, in the regiment of Alabama
Volunteers commanded by Colonel L G M. Million mus-
tered into the service of the United States the 19th of June,
1836, and being now mustered for discharge by the Acting Inspector General
of the United States Army, is therefore, hereby honorably discharged from
the said service.

ON THIS *Twentieth* day of *November* A. D. One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty, personally appeared before me *Jackson Smith an acting*

Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, *Franklin Milstead* aged *thirty eight*

years, a resident of *Cherokee County* in the State of *Alabama* who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical *Franklin Milstead*

who was a *private* in the Company commanded by Captain *Geo W Patrick* in the

Regiment of *Alabama* *Volunteers* commanded by *Colonel D. McMillin* in the War with *the Creek tribe of Indians*

that he *volunteered in said Company & Regiment* at *Montgomery Ala*

on or about the *19th* day of *June*, A. D. *1836* for the term of *three months*, and continued in actual service in said war for the term of *one month*

and that he was honorably discharged at *Montgomery Alabama* on the *Twenty first* day of *July*, A. D. *1836* as will

appear by his original certificate of discharge now with *presented* and by the muster rolls of said *Company*

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the bounty land to which he may be entitled under the 'Act granting bounty land to certain officers and soldiers who have been engaged in the Military service of the United States,' passed 28th September, 1850.
