Walter C. Hebbe was born March 23, 1893, at Perry, Kansas. While doing his chores about the barn Wednesday morning, July 24, 1935, his death came very unexpectedly. Mr. Hebbe passed away at the age of 42 years, 4 months and 1 day.

At one year of age his parents moved to Orlando, Oklahoma. Here he spent a part of his childhood. At about the age of 13, he united with the Potter Christian church, near Orlando. In 1907 he and his parents moved to Yates Center, Kansas, where they resided for one year; coming to Dover to live in 1908. Finishing his grammar schooling at Dover, he attended the Guthrie Business College, and graduated in 1911.

In 1914 he was united in marriage to Miss Fern Miller, who at that time was living with her parents upon the farm now owned by Mr. Hebbe, and where he and his family were residing at the time of his death, one mile north and one-half mile east of Dover.

Mr. Hebbe had grown up in the Dover community, and is well known among the business men and farmers. He provided well for his family and was a good neighbor.

He leaves to mourn, his wife, Mrs. Walter C. Hebbe; two daughters, Alieen and Glendon; his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Hebbe; three sisters, Mrs. Harshal Cline, Mrs. Van Wey, and Mrs. Austin Blackwell of Locust Grove, Oklahoma.
