

Transcription of the Personality Thomas Orr, Bundle 54, Package 19, # 2122 copied from microfilm located South Carolina Department of Archives & History is true to the original except for highlighting. Most pages were written on plain, lined papers. Exceptions include the Surety Bond and Letters of Administration that are "fill in blanks" printed forms. Most of the quickly jotted notes along the backside of folded papers are omitted in these transcriptions.

To **Herbert Hammond Ordinary** of Anderson District The petition of the undersigned Showeth that **Thomas Orr, late of Anderson District deceased** lately died **Intestate** having divers goods rights and Credits within the District aforesaid and that the Same may be duly administered your petitioner makes this application asking that the usual Citation may issue that at the proper time Letters of Administration may be obtained on the Estate of the Said deceased Intestate.

Know all men by these present, that we **James Orr, W. H. Ford and J. W. B. Orr** are holden and firmly bound unto **Herbert Hammond Esq., Ordinary** for the District aforesaid, in the full and just sum of **Twenty Thousand Dollars**, lawful money of this State, to be paid to the aforesaid, **Herbert Hammond Ordinary**, or his successor in office, or their certain Attorney or assigns, for which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves and every of our heirs, Executors, and Administrators, for the whole, and in the whole, jointly and severally, firmly by these present.

Sealed with our seals and dated the 27th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty six

The Condition of the above Obligation is such, That if the above bound James Orr Administrator of the goods, chattels, rights and credits of Thomas Orr, deceased, do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased, and which have or shall come into the hands, possession or knowledge of the said James Orr, or in the hands of any other person, or persons for him and the same so made, do exhibit the same in the said court of Ordinary, when he shall be thereunto required, and such goods, chattels, rights and credits do well and truly administer, according to law, and do make a perfect and true account of his actings and doings therein, when required by the said Court; and the rest of the goods, chattels, rights and credits which shall be remaining upon the account of the said administration, the same being first allowed by the said Court, shall pay and deliver unto such persons respectively as are entitled to the same by law. Then this obligation to be void, or else to remain in full force.

TO James Orr

Whereas Thomas Orr, late of Anderson District, deceased, lately died intestate, having whilst he lived, and the time of his death, divers goods, rights, and credits within the District aforesaid, by means whereof the full disposition and power of granting the administration of all and singular the goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased, and also auditing the accounts, calculations and reckonings of the said administration, and a final dismissal of the same, to me is manifestly known to belong, -- I desiring that the goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased may be well and truly administered, conerted and disposed of, do hereby grant unto the said James Orr in whose fidelity in this particular I very much confide, full power, by the tenor of these presents, to administer on the goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased, which to him in his life-time and at the time of his death did belong, and to ask, levy, recover and receive the same, and to pay the debts in which the deceased stood obliged, so far forth as his goods, chattels, rights and credits will extend, according to their rate and order of law; being first sworn on the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God, to make a true and perfect inventory thereof, and to exhibit the same into the Ordinary's office in Anderson in order to be recorded on or before the first day of June now next ensuing, and to render a just and true account, calculation and reckoning of the said administration, when thereunto required; and I ordain and constitute you the said James Orr administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels, rights and credits of the said deceased.
