A Part of the trust estate was in a negroe named Ellen or Nelly and Mrs. S. A. Rankin had the use of her till she was freed by the result of the war. And Also the full and free use of the land from the time it was bought until it was sold in December 1871 to two of her Sons Geo A Rankin and James C Rankin for the Sum of \$1350.

Deponent collected Seven hundred and twenty Six Dollars on or about the 11th Jany 1873 and paid it over to Sarah A Rankin as per receipt filed.

The balance of the trust estate in Deponents hands is in a note dated 14^{th} Dec 1871 on Geo A Rankin and J C Rankin for \$675 with interest from date of Said note this note being for the balance of the purchase money of the land.
